- Raise awareness and promote your volunteering roles, services, activities and events
- Provide direct access to the enthusiasm, knowledge and skills of our student, staff and graduate volunteers through events and presentations
- Organise potential fundraising opportunities
- Provide networking opportunities and share good practice
- Develop and enhance the role of University volunteers within your organisation
- Provide support whenever needed.
- Direct organisations to projects within the Student Futures Team and wider University to support Work Experience module opportunities, live projects within modules and internship opportunities

Volun-tees Partnership Policy

Volun-tees will work with the following groups:

- Voluntary and Community Groups
- Registered Charities
- Schools/Colleges/Educational Establishments
- Statutory Organisations
- Campaigning Organisations (We will not refer students to organisations that are closely connected with any political party)

We do not advertise opportunities for

• commercial organisations, private or profit-making companies as we view these as work experience and not true volunteering.

- Overseas volunteering opportunities.
- Organisations involved in activities which breach any Teesside University or Volun-tees policies, or which might bring disrepute to the University or volunteering scheme.

We expect all organisations to:

- provide appropriate induction/ training and support to volunteers (including all aspects of health & safety, information about risks and how to minimise risks, and emergency procedures).
- notify Volun-tees of any change of circumstance or problems with policy or procedures.
- notify us of any staffing changes which might affect the organisation registration on Volun-tees.
- maintain open communication with volunteers and Volun-tees/Teesside University throughout the activity/project, keep records of volunteers recruited and respond to requests for feedback so that volunteer progress may be monitored.

We regret we are unable to accept your registration if:

- your proposed volunteering opportunity impairs the employment opportunities of others by performing work that would otherwise be performed by regular, paid employees within the same organisation?
- the services provided by volunteers are the same services provided by someone who is paid.
- there is any expectation of compensation (financial or other) either now or in the future for services (except for travel, project resource and other approved out-of-pocket expenses)?
